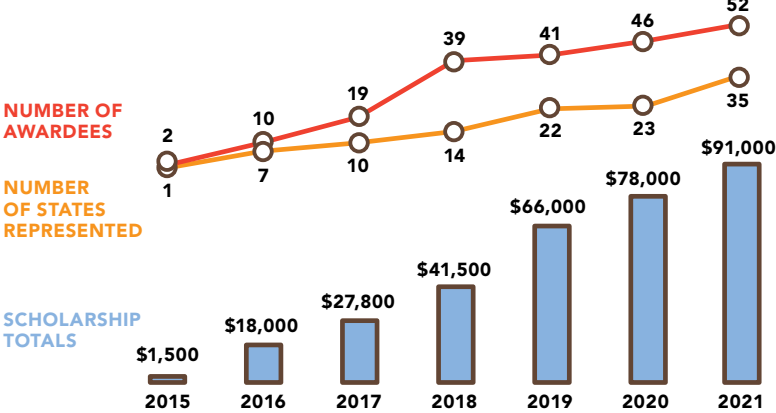

SCHOLARSHIP OVERVIEW

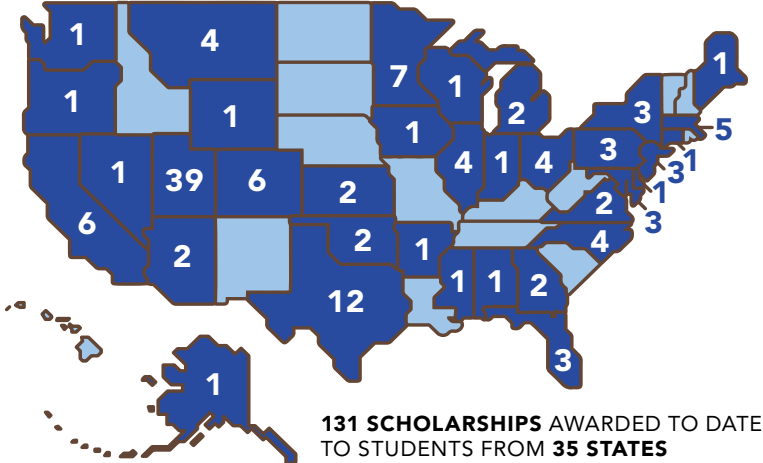
This year we received 207 scholarship applications from 46 different states. We ask our applicants to indicate how they heard about the scholarship and to our delight, there are a significant number of sources, in addition to the Joseph James Morelli Legacy Foundation website. In just seven years we have grown from awarding two scholarships in one state to 131 scholarships awarded in 35 states.

Each year we are overwhelmed and inspired by the words of gratitude so many of our recipients, like Jacen, share with us when they learn that they have received a scholarship.

MENTORING PROGRAM

Our mentoring program, led by Board of Director member Anne Ivanhoe, was launched in the Fall of 2019 with two mentor/mentee pairs. The objective of the mentoring program is to have peer mentors help scholarship recipients believe in themselves and realize their potential by “discovering their superpowers,” an expression developed by Jake Sussman with Superpower Consulting, our partner in this endeavor. Our mentors help our mentees to discover their “superpowers” — how to use them to navigate their learning environment and manage ongoing challenges associated with having learning differences. Our program grew to five pairs in the Spring of 2020 and will double by Fall 2021.

For many students, the social and emotional impact of attending college can cause a heavy toll. If students also have learning differences, they have the additional challenge of having to navigate the ins-and-outs of academic and personal independence with enough self-awareness to advocate for accommodations that will support their unique individual learning style.

Superpower Consulting is a mentorship firm designed to virtually match students with Dyslexia, ADHD, or other learning and attention challenges to a mentor with similar learning differences. It was founded on one simple belief: to have mentors guide and advise.

The mentorship is designed to empower and equip mentees with the skills they need to confidently succeed in any environment. We believe that when students are given the space to safely communicate and express their emotions; explore their habits and behaviors; and feel confident about their hobbies, their confidence skyrockets. This success gives them strength to tackle more challenging tasks, and their academic performance increases.

Our first year in partnership with the Joseph James Morelli Legacy Foundation has already impacted the lives of five scholarship awardees. Students have reported seeing an increase in their grades and class participation. They have gone outside their comfort zone and have been given the space to safely reach out to a peer mentor who has surmounted similar challenges.

I am honored to be part of the mentoring effort that is helping the Joseph James Morelli Legacy Foundation grow in new and exciting ways to benefit the dyslexic community. This program is so important because students can share obstacles they encounter with people that have the same challenges and have found ways to get through college. As a bonus, I have made a friendship with my mentor because “we who learn differently” share traits we don't often find in others around us, and it is great to be with people who “get us.”

I was three years old when my parents noticed dyslexic traits in their very bright child. I am the third known generation with dyslexia in my family. My grandmother was called dumb and put in the slow classes. She pursued her high school diploma in her twenties and later earned a degree in nursing. My mother was schooled in small parochial schools so avoided the labeling her mother was given and earned a bachelor's degree. I was homeschooled, which allowed me to be with tutors several times a week as I have dyslexia, dysgraphia, and dyscalculia.

The support that I have received as a two-time scholarship recipient has made me feel worthy of the Foundation's time and effort. I received my bachelor's degree in Aerospace Engineering in 2020 and got a job as an Aerospace engineer at a large aircraft manufacturer. I will be starting graduate school this fall. Thank you for including me in work that is Joseph's Legacy.

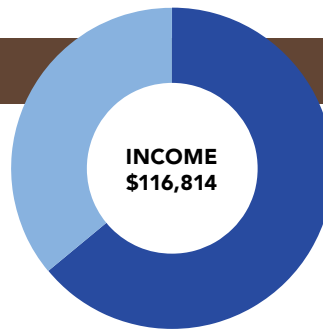


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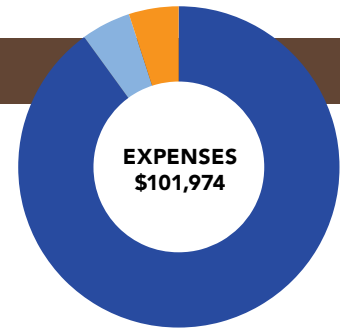
